Guess where this is? You would probably recognise it more if it was filled with water.

What do you notice right in the middle of the picture, all the way down at the bottom of that huge hole in the ground? It looks to me like a horse and cart.

Firstly, it gives us an idea of the scale of the quarry, and then it reminds us just how long ago this photograph was probably taken.

So which quarry is it?

Just from the scale it is what is today known as Stoney Cove. In the 19th century it had been two separate quarries, as you can see from these maps below.

You can see in both maps there are the two quarries, you can also see how much they have expanded in the 18 years between the two maps being surveyed and published.

At some point, quite soon after 1904, was probably when those two quarries were blasted with dynamite into the one quarry we see today.

This second link shows you an underwater map which is used by divers today to plan where and how long they can dive for, and just what is available for them to see down in the depths of the quarry.

It also shows that there are areas for beginners, areas for divers with more experience and the deepest are only for expert divers.

Diving can be an amazing hobby but it can also be very dangerous and strict rules apply to equipment and who can dive and for how long.

If you hover with your mouse over the map you will see extra information about the objects which have been deliberately placed there for the divers to discover.
